

JOINT HEALTH AND SAFETY COMMITTEE CERTIFICATION TRAINING - PART 1

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 9 of the Occupational Health and Safety Act states that all workplaces in Ontario, employing more than 20 workers must have a Joint Health and Safety Committee.

The Occupational Health and Safety Act states that at least one Worker and one Management member of the Joint Health and Safety Committee must have completed Part 1 and Part 2 Certification Training by a MOL authorized training provider.
