STOP! FALLS!

How it works

Once a confirmed date has been scheduled for the in-class session, you will be sent an information document containing the URL, the necessary login information, and troubleshooting tips. The e-learning module must be completed no more than 10 business days before your in-class session date. Once you have completed the e-learning portion of the program, you will need to print out the certificate generated at the end of the course, and show it to the instructor of your in-class session as proof of successful completion of the e-learning module.

The following elements are reviewed as part of the Working at Heights Training:

- A review of the duties and responsibilities of employers, supervisors and workers, including a review of a workers 3 basic rights
- Requirements for reporting unsafe conditions to the MLTSD
- Discussion about typical fall related accidents and injuries with a focus on ladders, scaffolds and other areas found in construction work places
- A review of the various fall prevention solutions are discussed including:
 - * Warning signs, barriers and bump lines
 - * Protective covers
 - * Guard rails and personal safety nets
 - * Travel restraint systems, fall restrict and fall arrest systems
 - * Understanding the need to calculate fall distance and swing falls
 - * Knowing about Suspension Trauma
 - * An in-depth discussion around the various fall protection equipment that can be used and how to use that equipment
 - * We discuss the need for the development of a fall protection plan including the need for a Fall Rescue Plan with a focus on eliminating or controlling hazards when working at heights.

Participants will be provided a working at heights wallet card once they have passed the in-person course. Their contact information will be provided to the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development and a record of their training will be maintained on a program called SkillsPass. Learners can access, view, print and share their training records online and on their smartphones 24/7 through SkillsPass™. .

Working at Heights Training expires 3 years from the date of training



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
